How to submit a paper

ACTRA is seeking abstracts for oral papers by midnight Thursday, 1st July 2010. Your abstract can be up to one A4 page in length and needs to clearly state the objectives and content of your proposed contribution. It may include figures, tables, diagrams and illustrations but not photos and the file size cannot be any more than 2 MB.

When you are sending your abstract, please include the following information in your covering email:

- the paper title—please keep this as brief as possible so that it will fit into the limited space allowance of the printed program
- your name or the name of a suitable contact person
- your company or organisation name
- your email address

What happens next?

You will be notified by 16th July 2010 whether or not your abstract has been accepted into the program.

If it is an accepted presentation, the title will be included in the published preliminary program and the abstract will be published in the event booklet.
